

Gary is the retired president of Kansas City's YARCO Property Management Company, an organization dedicated to providing decent, affordable housing for Americans with limited income. As many of you know, February is celebrated each year as African American History Month. In 1976, during the celebration of the United States Bicentennial, President Ford urged Americans to "seize the opportunity to honor the toooften neglected accomplishments of black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history" and designated February, the birth month of both Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, for this purpose.

A number of other countries celebrate this history as well. In spite of suffering the indignities, atrocities and injustice of slavery and segregation, African Americans have served this country honorably and valiantly during both peace and war. Executive Order 9981 was issued by President Harry Truman to abolish discrimination "on the basis of race, color, religion or national origin" in the Armed Forces of the United States. Recently, the newest class aircraft carrier was named the USS Doris Miller, after an African American sailor who was awarded the Navy Cross for heroism during the Pearl harbor attack and who was later killed in action. Some of you may also remember Harvey Bayless, who was a Tuskegee Airman and Chapter member until he passed back in 2014. I hope you will reflect upon the sacrifices and accomplishments of the many great African Americans who served this country in the military, government and civilian life in spite of the obstacles they faced. I look forward to seeing you all on February 22nd. In the meantime, stay warm and stay healthy.


