BIOGRAPHY

MAJOR JOSEPH W. MANGLITZ

Major Joseph Manglitz is the Wing Inspector General and B-2 Evaluator Pilot, 509th Bomb Wing, Whiteman Air Force Base, Missouri. As Inspector General, he directs the Wing Commander's Inspection Program to validate mission readiness and advises the Commander on personnel complaints as well as fraud, waste, and abuse issues. Additionally, he is a dual gualified B-2 Evaluator Pilot and T-38 Instructor Pilot maintaining combat readiness in both nuclear and conventional worldwide missions. Major Joseph Manglitz commissioned in 2008 through the ROTC program at the University of Nebraska. His first assignment was to attend Joint Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training at Vance AFB, Oklahoma. Upon graduation, he was assigned to the B-52 and completed initial qualification training at



Barksdale AFB, Louisiana before being assigned to the Bomber Barons of the 23d Bomb Squadron at Minot AFB, North Dakota. From 2011-2014, he served in a variety of positions including Flight Command and B-52 Instructor Pilot, and also deployed twice to the Pacific Command. In 2014, he was competitively selected to transfer to the B-2 stealth bomber at Whiteman AFB, Missouri. He completed initial qualification training as the Distinguished Graduate of his class and was assigned to the Grim Reapers of the 13th Bomb Squadron where he was the Chief of Training, Chief of Safety, and finally the Assistant Director of Operations and B-2 Evaluator Pilot. Following his time in the bomb squadron, he was selected by the Wing Commander as his Executive Officer. In 2019, Maj Manglitz completed studies at the Army's Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas as a Distinguished Graduate. Before returning back to Whiteman AFB, he served two years on the joint staff at US Strategic Command in Nebraska as the Branch Chief of Air Delivered Capabilities managing a portfolio including the B-21, B-52 modernization, and the Long Range Standoff Weapon. He is a senior pilot with more than 2000 flying hours.
